## Important Conditions to Note:

Hemiplegia/ Hemiparesis Quadriplegia/ Quadriparesis SOB when lying flat O2 Fever Vomiting Weight loss Open Lesions/ ulcers Foot ulcers/ lesions Surgical wounds Isolation

## Important Diagnosis to Note: (Current and PMHx)

CVA/TIA/Stroke TBI CP MS ALS Parkinson's Pneumonia Cancer of head or neck Morbid Obesity Asthma, COPD, Lung disease Diabetic Retinopathy

## **Observations when Eating, Drinking or Taking Medications:**

Loss of liquids/solids from mouth when eating or drinking

• When the resident has food or liquid in his or her mouth, the food or liquid dribbles down chin or falls out of the mouth.

Holding food in mouth/cheeks or residual food in mouth after meals.

- Holding food in mouth or cheeks for prolonged periods of time (sometimes labeled pocketing)
- Food left in mouth because resident failed to empty mouth completely.

Coughing or choking during meals or when swallowing medications.

- The resident may cough or gag, turn red, have more labored breathing,
- Difficulty speaking when eating, drinking, or taking medications.
- Complaints of food or medications "going down the wrong way."

Complaints of difficulty or pain with swallowing.

• Resident may refuse food because it is painful or difficult to swallow.
